PAC Women's Soccer Player of the Week

BRITTINY BENNETT Waynesburg College

Senior forward Copley, Ohio/Copley H.S.

Bennett posted three goals and an assist for seven points to lead Waynesburg to wins over Mount Aloysius (5-0) and PAC rival Thiel (2-0) last week. She scored twice in the win at Mount Aloysius, then added a penalty kick goal against the Tomcats to give her team-high totals of six goals and 14 points this season.

Also nominated was sophomore GK **Jess Alloggia** of Bethany, sophomore MF **Emily Hagedorn** of Thomas More, and sophomore MF **Mallory Bugel** of Westminster.

Bethany Bison

The Bison opened PAC play Thursday by battling Thomas More to a 0-0 tie in BC's home opener ... The Saints posted a 22-9 shot advantage, but Bison GK **Jessica Alloggia** stood tall ... The Bethany sophomore made 12 saves,

including five in the two OT sessions, to keep Thomas More off the board ... Of the Bison's nine shots, five were on goal and their best chance came early in the first OT, when junior **Jen Burin** pushed a shot wide of the left post ... The tie snapped Bethany's four-game losing streak, with each loss coming by one goal ... Alloggia continues to shine in net, as she has a 1.13 goals-against average (six goals in 476 minutes) ... Bethany hits the road for three games this week, including PAC road tilts at W&J and Thiel.



Thiel Tomcats

Thiel suffered a 7-0 setback at Case Western Wednesday evening before falling at Waynesburg in its PAC opener Saturday 2-0 ... Senior GK **Ashleigh Dunsmore** finished with 16 goals saves in the CWRU loss ... Waynesburg and Thiel entered the half knotted at 0-0, but the

Yellow Jackets responded with a pair of goals in the final 45 minutes to post the conference win ... WC's **Brittany Bennett** tallied the first on a penalty kick in the 86th minute before **Juliann Amato** used a Bennett assist to extend the lead to 2-0 in the 87th minute ... Dunsmore finished with 15 saves in the conference loss.



Grove City Wolverines

Grove City dropped a pair of non-conference matches last week ... Junior **Maia Siber** scored Grove City's lone goal Wednesday in a 2-1 loss to Mount Union ... Freshman goalkeeper **Diana Pragel** stopped six shots ... At Allegh-

eny Saturday, the Gators held a 37-4 shot advantage in downing Grove City 3-0 ... Pragel recorded nine saves ... The match at Allegheny was Grove City's first road match of the season ... It also started a run of four straight road matches for the Wolverines ... Grove City visits Westminster Wednesday before trekking to Waynesburg Friday afternoon.



Thomas More Saints

The Saints broke a four-game nonwinning streak by defeating Washington & Jefferson 3-1 with two second

half goals ... It was the school's first-ever PAC win in women's soccer ... Sophomores **Lisa Stricker** and **Emily Hagedorn** accounted for all three TMC goals ... Hagedorn scored twice, while Stricker had a goal and an assist ... The team's all-time leading goal scorer, **Cathy Santillo**, will not play this season due to an injury ... This week's contest will be the team's first matchup with Waynesburg ... TMC holds a 3-1 lead over Franklin, not allowing a goal as they have won three straight meetings.



Washington & Jefferson Presidents

The Presidents dropped a 3-0 decision to regionally-ranked Wittenberg Friday and then opened PAC play with a 3-1 setback at Thomas More Sunday ... The Tigers, ranked fourth in the Great Lakes Region, extended their shutout streak to seven games Friday ... Wittenberg led just 1-0 through the first 72 minutes, but added two late

goals ... Freshman GK **Jackie Foltz** made nine saves for W&J ... **Emily Hagedorn** netted a pair of goals Sunday as the Saints uphended the Presidents, 3-1 ... Senior MF **Lyndsey McCaskey** tied the game three minutes into the second half off an assist from freshman MF **Shannon Conn**, but the Saints scored two goals five minutes apart midway through the second half ... Foltz made five stops in the loss ... W&J held a 17-12 shot advantage.



Waynesburg Yellow Jackets

The Yellow Jackets posted a pair of shutout victories this week to extend their win streak to three games ... Waynesburg opened the week with a 5-0 victory in non-conference action against Mt. Aloysius ... In the victory against the Mounties, the Jackets received a pair of goals from both senior **Brittiny Bennett** and freshman **Ashley**

Johnson ... Juliann Amato added the other Waynesburg goal in the five-goal win ... The Yellow Jackets attempted six corner kicks in the game with half of them resulting in a goal ... In the conference opener against Thiel, Waynesburg posted a 2-0 victory with both goals scored during the final five minutes ... Bennett scored the first when she converted a penalty kick in the 86th minute ... Amato added an insurance goal less than a minute later off an assist from Bennett ... GKs Amy Mills and Emily Byers split the shutout.





Westminster ran its win streak to four with non-league home wins over Pitt-Greensburg (4-0) and Wittenberg (2-1 in OT) last week ... Against UP-G, sophomore MF Mallory Bugel and freshman MF Abby Montgomery each had a goal and an assist in the opening half Junior F Sarah Calderone built the lead to 3-0 with a goal assisted by Bugel ... Freshman MF Jessica Losteter closed the scoring ... Wittenberg entered Saturday at 8-0 (having outscored its opponents 15-1) and ranked fourth in the region ... After a PK put the

Tigers up 1-0, Westminster tied the contest on a goal by Bugel assisted by Montgomery, then Bugel set up Calderone for the gamewinner with 50 seconds left in the first overtime.
