Bethany Bison

Bethany went 1-0-1 in a pair of PAC matches last week and are now 1-2-4 in their last seven contests ... The Bison recorded their first win of the

season Tuesday with a 1-0 victory at Thiel ... The lone score of the match came in the 21st minute when **Lisa Wabrick** finished off a corner kick from **Kortni Collins** ... It was the first goal of the year for Wabrick and the second assist for Collins ... GK **Jess Alloggia** ensured the lead would stand by stopping three shots for her second shutout of the year ... Saturday, BC and Waynesburg battled to their second 1-1 tie of the season ... Bethany took the lead in the 14th minute on an unassisted goal by **Michelle McGinley**.



Geneva Golden Tornadoes

Geneva finally put an end to its six-game losing streak and three-game scoreless streak with a 1-1 tie against Chatham ... **Amanda Caler** broke

the streak with the game tying goal early in the second half ... **Amber Weaver** preserved the tie by stopping a penalty kick with less than five minutes remaining in overtime.
