After having its match with Saint Vincent stopped due of thunderstorms, Bethany ran its unbeaten streak to four with a 3-1 win over Thiel Saturday ... The Saint Vincent match was halted with 37 minutes left in the second half and the Bearcats leading 3-1, with the only Bison score coming from **Katie Mills** ... Because the game did not go the NCAA-mandated 70 minutes, the contest will have to be replayed ... Saturday, Bethany started PAC play with a Homecoming win over Thiel ... Mills, who was a defender through her career until recently, continued her strong play up front by recording a hat trick ... Sophomore **Ruthie Pettie** assisted on both of Mills' first half scores, which came in the 12th and 35th minutes ... GK **Courtney Teets** only needed one save to pick up the win, as Bethany outshot the Tomcats 27-4.



Thiel Tomcats

Thiel battled Chatham to a scoreless double-overtime tie before dropping its PAC opener at Bethany, 3-1 ... Sophomore MF **Jamie Dawson** scored the lone goal for the Tomcats against the Bison ... Freshman GK **Sarah Echenoz** made five saves against Chatham, then made nine

stops at Bethany.



Washington & Jefferson Presidents

Washington & Jefferson dropped its third-straight contest on Saturday, falling at Westminster by a 3-2 margin ... The Presidents held 1-0 and 2-1 leads, but two late goals by **Sarah Calderone** proved to be the difference ... Freshman F **Molly Macloce** knocked home both President goals, the first goals of her career ... Freshman F **Tiffany**

Shered assisted on the first goal, while sophomore D **Samantha Sosko** delivered the second assist ... A total of 10 different Presidents have now scored at least one goal this season ... Five have scored two times and five have netted one goal.



Westminster Titans

Senior F **Sarah Calderone** scored the game-tying and game-winning goals for the Westminster as it secured a 3-2 win at home Saturday over Washington & Jefferson in the Titans' PAC opener ... Grove City opened PAC play Saturday with a 5-1 win at Waynesburg ... It is Grove City's second win over the Yellow Jackets this year ... Sophomore MF **Laura Shipley** scored twice in the victory while junior MF **Bethany Peck** scored the eventual game-winner at 24:37 ... Senior D **Lindsay Bowman** scored her first goal of 2006, off **Sara Griffin's** corner kick ... Freshman **Michelle Peck** added an insurance goal ... GK **Diana Prigel** earned the victory, stopping three shots ... Grove City has already surpassed its 2005 win total ... Saturday's victory stopped a two-game losing streak ... Freshman **Hannah Yang** made her first career start in the win ... Lightning postponed Grove City's non-conference match at Carnegie Mellon Oct. 4 ... Grove City visits archrival Westminster Tuesday.



Thomas More Saints

Thomas More extending its winning streak to four with a pair of non-conference wins over PAC teams, beating Waynesburg, 3-0 and Saint Vincent, 4-1 ... Junior GK **Carlin Scrudato** played in 166 minutes of scoreless soccer, raising her active streak to 346 consecutive minutes without allowing a goal.



Waynesburg Yellow Jackets

The Yellow Jackets suffered a pair of losses last week to drop to 3-7-1 overall and 0-1 in conference play ... Against Thomas More, the Yellow Jackets fell behind 1-0 in the first half before the Saints scored their second goal in the 74th minute and added an insurance goal five minutes later ... GK **Amy Mills** allowed three goals while recording seven saves in over 86 minutes of action ... Saturday, Waynesburg suffered a 5-1 loss to Grove City at John F. Wiley Stadium ... The Wolverines took a 3-0 lead in the first period before adding two more goals in the first 10 minutes of the second half ... Freshman **Joanna Butterworth** scored the only goal in the game for the Yellow Jackets in the 68th minute on a penalty kick.

The Lady Bearcats led Bethany by a 3-1 score with 37 minutes remaining in the game when a lightning storm forced a postponement ... The game was declared "no contest" ...
