Bethany Bison

The Bison took a step back in time to 1999, the last year they won the PAC crown, during their 3-0 week ... The week began with a 6-2 thrashing of PSU-Altoona, the most goals scored in a game since October of 1999 ... Junior **Jen Burin** recorded two goals and two assists and **Caelyn DiSanti** finished with two goals ... **Rachelle Smith** and **Pennie Thomas** also scored in the rout ... BC then rallied for a 2-1 win over Grove City Wednesday for their first win over GCC since October, 1999 ... After falling behind in the 13th minute, Thomas and DiSanti notched goals before halftime and the Bison held on for the win ... Thomas also assisted on DiSanti's game-winner ... The week ended with a 3-0 triumph over Thiel on Homecoming.



Grove City Wolverines

Grove City closed the week with an 8-0 victory over Thiel at College Field Thursday afternoon ... Seven different Grove City players scored a goal ... **Stacey Brubaker** scored twice while **Kate Klingensmith** and **Bethany Peck** each had a goal and an assist ... Freshman **Katie Wolff** scored her first collegiate goal while **Maia Siber**, **Alix Flowers** and **Bethany Smith** all had goals, also ... **Bethany Preston** made one save over the first 70 minutes while Brubaker stopped two shots in 20 minutes in goal ... **Laura Shipley** scored Grove City's lone goal in a 2-1 loss at Bethany Wednesday ... The unassisted goal came on a free kick ... It was Grove City's first loss to Bethany in 11 matches ... Grove City had won 20 straight October matches prior to the defeat.



Thiel Tomcats

The Tomcats dropped four straight road PAC contests last week, losing at W&J 4-0 on Tuesday, at Grove City 8-0 on Thursday, 3-0 at Bethany on Saturday and 9-0 at Thomas More on Sunday ... Senior GK **Ashleigh Dunsmore** recorded a career-high 29 saves in the loss to W&J and finished the week averaging 22.5 saves per game ... Dunsmore was ranked 10th in the latest Division III statistics report, averaging 11.33 saves per game.



Thomas More Saints

The Saints broke a school record for goals in a two-game span (18) after beating Thiel 9-0 ... It was the second straight 9-0 decision, helping Thomas More to break the 1995 record of 17 ... Sophomore **Emily Hagedorn** became the second TMC player in as many games to secure her first career hat trick, following junior **Julianne Brown** - who scored three against Franklin ... In that same two game span, the Saints have outshot opponents 106-2, including a 60-1 advantage over the Tomcats ... Hagedorn was the lone Thomas More player with multiple goals as seven different players found the back of the net ... The women's soccer team has recorded shutouts in three of the last four games.



Washington & Jefferson Presidents

W&J recorded its biggest win in school history Saturday in New Wilmington as the Presidents knocked off Westminster, 2-1 ... W&J snapped a 14-match winless streak (0-13-1) versus the Lady Titans and handed Westminster its first loss in eight games ... Junior MF **Micala Priola** scored the game winner in the second half for the Presidents ... Senior MF **Rachel Campbell** tied the game late in the first half ... Campbell assisted on three first-half goals in the 4-0 victory over Thiel, two of which were scored by senior F **Jen Pergola** ... Pergola netted the game's only goal in the 2nd minute at Waynesburg off assists from senior F **Toni Lynn Simonini** and sophomore D **Autumn Meredith** ... Pergola's three goals this week increased her career total to 51.



Waynesburg Yellow Jackets

The Waynesburg College women's soccer team suffered a pair of conference shutouts this week, losing 4-0 to Westminster before Washington & Jefferson posted a 1-0 shutout over the Yellow Jackets ... In the game against W&J, the Presidents scored the lone goal of the game in the opening two minutes and was able to withhold the Waynesburg attack ... Sophomore GK **Amy Mills** recorded a season- and career-high 12 saves in the W&J contest ... Against the Titans, Westminster jumped to a quick 3-0 in the opening half, including two goals in the opening 26 minutes ... Three Yellow Jacket goalkeepers combined to record five saves on 16 Titan shot attempts, compared to the two taken by Waynesburg - both of which were by freshman **Meghan Randolph**.



Westminster Titans

Westminster opened the week with a 4-0 PAC victory at Waynesburg Monday, before seeing its eight-game win streak snapped Saturday with a 2-1 home loss to W&J ... Freshman MF **Jessica Losteter** opened the scoring Monday with a goal assisted by junior F **Christa Andamasaris**, who also assisted the second goal by sophomore F **Mallory Bugel** ... Sophomore F **Olivia Wilkerson** made it 3-0 with an unassisted goal just before halftime. The final tally came from freshman MF **Christina Adams** off a Bugel assist ... Freshman GK **Whitney Griffin** made one save to post her seventh shutout in 12 contests ... Junior F **Sarah Calderone** scored the lone goal against W&J, as the Lady Titans lost despite a 24-8 shot advantage.
