# MALLORY BUGEL Westminster College

Sophomore forward Valencia, Pa./Mars Area H.S.

Bugel scored five goals in two conference games last week, as the Lady Titans remained in sole possession of first place in the PAC with league wins at Grove City (3-0) and vs. Bethany (5-0). She posted a pair of second half goals against GCC and a hat trick vs. the Bison, giving her a PAC-high 14 goals this season.

Also nominated was junior M **Jen Burin** of Bethany, junior D **Kandice Eckerlin** of Thomas More, senior F **Jen Pergola** of Washington & Jefferson, and freshman F/M **Juliann Amato** of Waynesburg.

# **Bethany Bison**

Bethany ran their win streak to five games with a big win over Waynesburg Wednesday before falling at three-time defending PAC champion Westminster ... The Bison offense continued its outstanding production in an 8-2 rout of

Waynesburg ... The Jackets scored the first two goals in the opening 5:15, but Bethany responded with three goals before halftime and five more in the second half ... Captain **Jen Burin** turned in three goals, the first time a BC player has scored a hat trick since **Missy Gibson** against Thiel in Oct., 2000 ... Senior F **Pennie Thomas** added one goal and a school-record tying three assists, while **Rachelle Smith** had two goals and **Caelyn DiSanti** recorded one goal and two assists.



### Thiel Tomcats

Thiel suffered a 5-0 home loss to Waynesburg Friday in the only action of the week for the Tomcats ... Senior GK **Ashleigh Dunsmore** had eight saves for Thiel in the loss ... According to the Oct. 9 NCAA Division III statistical rankings, Dunsmore was ranked third in the nation with

an average of 14.77 saves per game.



# **Grove City Wolverines**

Grove City fell to 3-3-1 in the PAC with a 3-0 home loss to Westminster Thursday afternoon ... Westminster broke the match open with three second-half goals ... **Bethany Preston** stopped nine shots for Grove City ... At Wash-

ington & Jefferson Tuesday night, senior **Kristin Hummel** scored her first goal of the season, helping the Wolverines earn a 1-1 draw ... Junior **Maia Siber** supplied the assist ... Grove City outshot the Presidents 5-2 in overtime but could not break the tie ... Preston had three saves ... Grove City hosts Waynesburg and Bethany in a pair of critical PAC matches before making its first-ever trip to Thomas More Saturday afternoon.



#### Thomas More Saints

For the second straight week, the Saints broke a school record as they recorded their fifth consecutive shut-

out by beating the Yellow Jackets, 2-0 ... After three early losses, Thomas More has battled back with a seven-game unbeaten streak. They have outscored their opponents, 25-1, during that stretch ... Junior **Julianne Brown** has recorded an assist in five straight games, while **Emily Hagedorn** scored her eighth goal in six games for the Saints.



# Washington & Jefferson Presidents

After picking up perhaps the biggest win in school history last Saturday, the W&J women's soccer team tied Grove City, 1-1, Tuesday ... W&J forced its third tie in history versus the Wolverines in 24 all-time meetings ... The Presidents have only defeated GCC once in history ... The Presidents fell behind 1-0 early, but senior F Jen Pergola

scored her eighth goal of the season in the 57th minute after collecting a loose ball and firing a left-footed shot into the empty net ... Freshman GK **Jackie Foltz** made six saves in a 2-0 loss to Thomas More ... W&J outshot the Saints, 10-8, on Thursday but could not beat TMC GK **Carlin Scrudato** ... Pergola has now totaled 52 career goals.



# Waynesburg Yellow Jackets

The Yellow Jackets suffered PAC losses to both Bethany and Thomas More this week ... In between those games, Waynesburg ended a fivegame losing streak with a 5-0 shutout victory over Thiel ... In the win over the Tomcats, freshman **Juliann Amato** recorded her first collegiate hat trick, including a pair of unassisted goals ... She

leads the Yellow Jackets with seven goals, five assists and 19 points this season ... MFs **Kate Zimmerman** and **Erin Mali** each scored a goal in the win, while GKs Amy Mills and Emily Byers split the shutout, each playing 45 minutes ... Saturday, Mills and Byers split time and combined for 10 saves in a 2-0 loss to Thomas More ... Waynesburg received a pair of goals from Mali to give them an early 2-0 lead Wednesday against Bethany ... The Bison responded with eight unanswered goals to claim an 8-2 victory.





Westminster solidified its conference lead and took a big step towards clinching the top seed and home field advantage for the PAC Tournament after posting league shutout wins at Grove City (3-0) and vs. Bethany (5-0) last week ... Senior F **Mallory Bugel** tallied five goals in the two contests, including a hat trick against the Bison ... Grove City played the Lady Titans to a scoreless first half Thursday, but a pair of second half Bugel goals sandwiched around a score by freshman M **Abby Montgomery** proved to be the difference ... Freshman

GK Whitney Griffin made four saves in goal ... In addition to Bugel, sophomores Kristen Martin and Jessica Kausits also scored vs. Bethany, with junior F Christa Andamasaris posting three assists.
