Bethany Bison

BC was shut out in a pair of matches last week, dropping a 2-0 decision to Saint Vincent and a 3-0 contest to W&J ... The loss to W&J severely dam-

aged Bethany's PAC Tournament hopes, meaning the Bison will likely need a win over co-conference leader Thomas More Wednesday to make the league playoffs ... Senior GK **Jess Alloggia** stopped 10 shots against Saint Vincent, but the Bearcats scored once in each half for the victory ... After the Thomas More game, Bethany will close out the regular season Friday evening at Geneva.



Geneva Golden Tornadoes

The winless streak for Geneva's women's soccer team has reached 11 straight with a pair of losses last week ... Geneva continues to com-

pete with every team it plays, but simply can't find ways to score ... Despite out shooting Thiel 22-1 on Saturday night, Geneva lost 1-0 as the Tomcats were able to find the net on their only shot of the night ... The Golden Tornadoes had chance after chance in the second half, but once again was unable to score ... Geneva has managed just 12 goals in 16 matches this year.
