PAC WOMEN'S SOCCER 2009 - Week 9 Conference Notes

PAC PLAYOFFS: The top of the standings were shook up when Grove City gave Thomas More its first conference loss ... Heading into the final week of the regular season, Grove City looks to defend its current hold on the PAC title and home-field advantage for the conference tournament ... Though it dropped two matches last week, Geneva must gain at least a win and a tie in the final two games of the season to qualify for NCCAA post-season.

NEWS & NOTES: By splitting games last week, the Presidents sit in a three-way tie for third place in the conference standings with Bethany and Westminster; however, a victory over the Bison would clinch a spot in the conference tournament and give W&J the tiebreaker against both squads ... The Bison climbed right into the thick of the PAC playoffs chase with a pair of shutouts last week ... Grove City's six-match win streak is its longest since the Wolverines won seven straight Sept. 15-Oct. 5, 2007.

AROUND THE LEAGUE: Freshman GK **Jenn Cantella** made 12 saves, 11 vs. W&J and one vs. Thiel, in net for the Titans as her shutout vs. Thiel was her fourth of the season ... Thomas More's GK **Jenna Kramer** has played 1463:57 in goal and has allowed 10 goals and recorded 77 saves as she has a 14-2 record and a 10 shutouts ... Bethany, which was allowed just 5 shots in the last 3 matches, earned its third straight shutout, the most since posting a BCrecord 4 clean sheets in 1992.

Bethany Bison (9-6-2, 3-2 PAC)

The Bison climbed right into the thick of the PAC playoffs chase with a pair of shutouts last week ... Bethany outshot Waynesburg 25-2, but only needed

an unassisted goal from **Cassie Spalding** in the 33rd minute and one save from **Brittany Sadler** for a 1-0 triumph over the Yellow Jackets ... The Bison exploded for five goals in a span of 16 minutes in the first half against Chatham and coasted to a 6-0 win Saturday ... **Suzy Ruckel** celebrated Senior Day with two goals and Spalding, the PAC leader in goals and points, scored twice and assisted on 3 others for 7 points, the most by a Bison in a match since 2000.

Geneva Golden Tornadoes (7-8)



A pair of one-goal losses highlighted a frustrating week for the Geneva women's soccer team ... Close losses to Chatham and Saint Vincent pushed its season long losing streak to five straight games ...

Rebecca Shaw scored Geneva's lone goal in a 2-1 loss to Chatham and Shaw opened the scoring at Saint Vincent ... **Maura Allen** gave Geneva some life with the game tying goal in the final five minutes at Saint Vincent, but a ricochet shot bounced into the Geneva net with just over one minute remaining in regulation ... Geneva has suffered five one-goal losses this year, including the last three matches.

Saint Vincent Bearcats (4-13)

Shasko had a big day for the Bearcats in the win, figuring in on all three goals, scoring once while assisting on two others ... **Carly Duffy** also scored her first career goal in the Geneva contest, while **Kirstie Mills** made seven saves for the win in goal.
