Bethany Bison

Bethany's 2007 season ended on a high note, as they took eventual top seed Thomas More to OT before shutting out Geneva 1-0 ... Against TMC,

GK **Jess Alloggia** stopped 10 shots, as the Bison held the Saints, the highest-scoring team in the PAC, off the scoreboard until they scored the only goal with 53 seconds left in OT ... In the season finale, junior Ruthie Pettle scored an unassisted goal in the 14th minute and Alloggia made eight saves as the Bison completed the season with a road win at Geneva ... It was the third shutout of the year for Alloggia and the sixth of her career ... Pettle's goal gave her the team lead with eight points.



Geneva Golden Tornadoes

Geneva ended its season having gone winless in the final 13 matches ... The Golden Tornadoes could not get out of their scoring drought down

the stretch and dropped two more shutout losses in the final week of the season ... Despite a strong effort against Grove City, Geneva allowed a pair of second half goals, which proved to be the difference ... On Friday night, Geneva outshot Bethany, but dropped a 1-0 decision ... Saint Vincent ended the regular season on a sixgame winning streak, with wins over Thiel and Waynesburg ... In the rainy win over Thiel, Adrianne Groth scored twice, while Shelly Teems scored
