Thomas More College Sophomore midfielder Fort Thomas, Ky./Newport Central Catholic H.S.

Hagedorn posted five goals in three matches while leading the Saints to a 2-1 record last week. She scored both tallied in a 2-0 PAC win over Thiel, then added a hat trick in the first 18 minutes of a 6-0 defeat of Bluffton.

Also nominated was senior F **Pennie Thomas** of Bethany, senior M **Katie Klingensmith** of Grove City, senior F **Jen Pergola** of Washington & Jefferson, and sophomore D **Brittany McKee** of Westminster.

Bethany Bison

Bethany concluded the season by splitting a pair of home games last week ... In a 4-1 triumph over Waynesburg, freshman **Caelyn DiSanti** scored two goals and **Jen Burin** and **Pennie Thomas** both had a goal and an assist

... The Yellow Jackets scored first in the seventh minute but Burin tied the game in the 13th and DiSanti scored her first of the day in the 33rd ... In the second half, DiSanti added her second and Thomas added a PK to give Bethany their fifth PAC victory of the year, the most for a Bethany team since their last conference title in 1999 ... The season ended with a 2-0 loss to Westminster Saturday ... Thomas finished the year with 10 goals, the first time BC player reached double figures since **Missy Gibson** in 2000.



Thiel Tomcats

The Tomcat women's soccer team dropped their final two matches of the 2005 season, falling to Grove City 3-0 on Tuesday and to Thomas More 2-0 on Thursday ... Senior GK **Ashleigh Dunsmore** totaled 14 saves in the Grove City loss ... Dunsmore finished with 19 saves against

Thomas More ... She finished her Tomcat career by starting all 83 games and finishing first in career shutouts (13) and first in career saves (641).



Grove City Wolverines

Grove City enters this week's PAC Championship Tournament as the No. 4 seed and will visit top-seeded Westminster Tuesday afternoon ... The Wolverines opened the week with a 3-0 win at Thiel ... Junior **Maia Siber** scored

the game-winner while **Katie Klingensmith** and **Anne Koller** added insurance goals ... **Stacey Brubaker** assisted both Siber and Klingensmith ... Koller scored on a penalty kick, Grove City's first PK goal of the season ... At Behrend Thursday, Klingensmith scored Grove City's lone goal in a 5-1 defeat ... Brubaker had the assist ... W&J clinched the No. 2 seed in the PAC Tournament with a 2-0 win at Grove City Saturday ... Tuesday's match at Westminster represents the fourth straight year that the Wolverines and Lady Titans will meet in the PAC Tournament.



Thomas More Saints

With back-to-back shutouts over Thiel and Bluffton, the Saints broke the school record for most shutouts in a

season with 12 ... They had their school record streak of consecutive shutouts in a season broken at eight, and TMC's 10-match unbeaten streak was also snapped with Tuesday's loss to the Titans ... Sophomore **Emily Hagedorn** recorded her second hat trick of the season, scoring three goals in the game's 18 minutes against Bluffton ... She added both goals in the Saints' 2-0 win at Thiel. In their inaugural season, the Saints will travel to Washington & Jefferson for the semifinals of the PAC tournament.



Washington & Jefferson Presidents

W&J increased its late win streak to four matches after victories over Waynesburg and Grove City this week ... The second-place finish in the PAC regular-season standings is the best in the program's history ... A win over TMC on Tuesday would equal the Presidents' school-record win totals of the past two seasons ... Senior F Jen

Pergola scored both goals on Tuesday on Senior Night vs. Waynesburg ... Pergola scored 61 seconds into the match and then netted the game winner with 10 minutes remaining ... Senior MF **Rachel Campbell** opened the scoring in the 11th minute at Grove City Saturday and Pergola put the game away with a goal in the 75th minute off an assist from classmate **Toni Lynn Simonini** ... Freshman GK **Jackie Foltz** made six saves on Saturday to record her fourth shutout of the season.



Westminster Titans

Having already clinched the top seed for the PAC Tournament, Westminster closed the 2005 regular season in strong fashion with shutout road wins at PAC rivals Thomas More (1-0) and Bethany (2-0) ... Sophomore F **Mallory Bugel** scored the long goal of the TMC game for her PAC-high 19th score of the season ... Freshman MF **Abby Montgomery** and sophomore MF **Kaitlyn Hardman** both found the back of the net against Bethany, with junior F **Christa Andamasaris** postin her team-high 11th assist of the year on the Hardman

goal ... If Westminster defeats fourth-seeded Grove City in a PAC Tournament semifinal on Tuesday at 2 p.m. in New Wilmington, Westminster will host the PAC title match Saturday at 1 p.m.



Waynesburg Yellow Jackets

The Yellow Jackets closed out the regular season with a pair of losses this week to PAC foes W&J and Bethany ... Against the Presidents, Waynesburg found itself down 1-0 after the opening minutes before freshman **Juliann Amato** scored her team-best eighth goal of the season in the 75th minute ... Assisting on the goal was

freshman **Amanda Picciafoco** ... W&J reclaimed the lead four minutes later when **Jen Pergola** scored her second goal of the contest ... In the final game, Waynesburg suffered a 4-1 defeat to Bethany ... The Jackets took an early 1-0 lead in the opening 10 minutes off a goal by D **Amanda Serjak**, her first points of the season ... The Bison, however, tied the game in the 13th minute before adding three more unanswered goals ... Junior GK **Emily Byers** posted a season-best 10 saves in her lone start of the season.
