TOURNAMENT TIME: The 2008 PAC Women's Soccer Championship Tournament gets underway this week with three matches to determine the recipient of the PAC's automatic bid to the NCAA Division III playoffs ... Both semifinal contests are Wednesday at 2 p.m., as #4 Grove City travels to top-seeded Thomas More, while #3 W&J heads to #2 seed and defending champion Westminster ... The finals will be Saturday at the top remaining seed, with game time announced Wednesday.

WHO'S HOT: Senior Kylie Simonini scored twice for Saint Vincent in a 3-0 victory over Chatham to become the all-time leading scorer in Bearcat history with 44 goals, including a teambest 12 this season ... Geneva GK Lauren Londino posted her school-record 10th shutout of the season in a 3-0 GT victory at Thiel ... Sophomore M Danielle Struble scored two goals and added two assists for Westminster in a 10-0 blanking of Chatham ... W&J has not allowed a goal in its last 480 minutes. **AROUND THE LEAGUE:** Grove City senior F Stephanie Wild scored the lone goal in a 1-0 win over Geneva ... Thomas More senior D **Mindy Cooper** scored her first collegiate goal on Senior Night in a 6-0 win over Bethany ... Bethany F **Cassie Spalding** scored 11 goals in 2008, the most by a Bison freshman since **Missy Miller** (14) in 1992 ... Thiel sophomore GK **Jill Harry** stopped 13 shots in a 1-0 PAC loss to Saint Vincent ... Chatham senior GK **Mary McMahon** is ranked 24th in Division III in save percentage.

Bethany Bison (7-8-4, 2-4-1 PAC)

Bethany's most successful season since 1999 came to an end with losses at W&J and Thomas More ... The Bison's seven wins are the most since they

won a school record 12 when they captured the PAC crown nine years ago ... Freshman Cassie Spalding led the team with 11 goals, the most by a Bison player since Missy Gibson registered 15 in 2000 ... It was also the most goals scored by a BC freshman since Missy Miller scored 14 in 1992 ... Bethany also set a single-season school record with six shutouts, with four being recorded by freshman GK Julie Brady ... The Bison will lose three seniors from this season, including Emily Bota, Ruthie Pettle and Courtney Teets.

Geneva Golden Tornadoes (8-4-5)



Geneva and sophomore GK Lauren Londino saw their streak of four consecutive shutouts come to an end with a 1-0 loss to Grove City on Saturday ... GOLDEN TORNADOES A goal 1 1/2 minutes into the match held up and

Geneva lost for just the second time in 13 matches ... Londino had posted her record setting 10th shut-out of the season on Wednesday when the Golden Tornadoes defeated Thiel 3-0 ... Amanda Caler and Kelsey Anderson each scored on penalty kicks and teammate Rebecca Bigenho scored her first collegiate goal at Thiel ... The Golden Tornadoes finished the regular season with an impressive 8-4-5 record and will wait for the NCCAA Eastern regionals later this month.

Saint Vincent Bearcats (6-9-4)
