### Semifinal #1 - Wednesday, November 1 #2 WESTMINSTER 1, #3 GROVE CITY 0

Westminster College - New Wilmington, Pa. - 2 p.m.

The Titans jumped out front with an early goal, then the Westminster defense held strong the rest of the way en route to the PAC championship match. Junior MF Kait Etzel-Hardman (Pittsburgh, PA/Baldwin H.S.) headed in a corner kick from senior F Christa Andamasaris (Warren, OH/Champion H.S.) just 3:36 into the match for the lone score of the contest. Westminster held a 22-8 advantage in shots and a 4-1 margin in corner kicks. Grove City had scoring opportunities, including a shot that caromed off the crossbar, but the Titan defense posted the shutout behind four saves by freshman GK Lindsey Mellott (Cortland, OH/Lakeview H.S.). Sophomore GK Diana Pragel (Rochester, NY/Greece Arcadia H.S.) had 10 saves in the loss for the Wolverines.

### Semifinal #1 - Wednesday, November 1 #1 THOMAS MORE 1, #4 WASH. & JEFF. 0

Town & Country Soccer Complex - Wilder, Ky. - 4 p.m.

The top-seeded and defending champion Saints took the lead early on a goal by freshman F Brittany Jones (Cincinnati, OH/Oak Hills H.S.) assisted by junior MF Emily Hagedorn (Fort Thomas, KY/Newport Central Catholic H.S.) just 5:35 into the contest. The TMC defense made the lead hold up, as the Presidents were limited to just six shots in the loss. The Saints posted an 11-6 margin in shots and a 9-5 advantage in corner kicks. Thomas More junior GK Carlin Scrudato (Liberty Township, OH/Lakota West H.S.) made six saves in goal to post the shutout, while sophomore GK Jackie Foltz (Port Royal, PA/Juniata H.S.) stopped five shots in the loss for W&J.

## PAC Championship - Saturday, November 4 #2 WESTMINSTER 0, #1 THOMAS MORE 0 (2ot) (Westminster wins on penalty kicks - 4-3)

Town & Country Soccer Complex - Wilder, Ky. - 7 p.m.

The top-seeded Saints (2005 PAC champions) and second-seeded Titans (three-time PAC champs from 2002-04) battled through 120 minutes of back-and-forth action, with neither team able to find the back of the net. The 2006 title went to penalty kicks, with Westminster coming away victorious with four consecutive successful PK attempts, while Thomas More sandwiched failed kicks in its first and fifth attempts around three successful PKs. Sophomore MF Christina Adams (Hubbard, OH/Hubbard H.S.), junior D Brittany McKee (Hubbard, OH/Hubbard H.S.) and sophomore D Jessica Losteter (Jefferson Hills, PA/Thomas Jefferson H.S.) each scored on their PK attempts for the Titans before junior D Kristen Martin (Pittsburgh, PA/North Allegheny H.S.) connected on the eventual game-winner. For the Saints, senior MF Kari Poling (Cincinnati, OH/Northwest H.S.), junior MF Emily Hagedorn (Fort Thomas, KY/Newport Central Catholic H.S.) and senior F Cathy Santillo (Harrison, OH/Harrison H.S.) were each successful in their PK attempts. Westminster held a 12-8 advantage over Thomas More in regulation and overtime, while adding a 6-0 margin in corner kicks. Freshman GK Lindsay Mellott (Cortland, OH/Lakeview H.S.) made one save in goal in regulation and OT for the Titans, while Saint junior GK Carlin Scrudato (Liberty Township, OH/Lakota West H.S.) stopped four shots in the first 120 minutes.
