A busy week saw Bethany fall in four matches, including their first two PAC contests of the season ... BC nearly pulled out a win at Thomas More, but after taking a 2-1 lead following doubles play, the Saints recorded wins in four of the six singles matches to claim the victory ... Seniors **Jen Hubble** and **Sarah Goho** were double winners in the Thomas More match, as Hubble teamed with **Krystal Robinson** for an 8-6 win at third doubles, then registered a 6-1, 6-0 win at fifth singles ... Goho, playing with **Elise Gardner**, also won by an 8-6 count at second doubles and claimed a three-set decision at fourth singles (6-1, 3-6, 7-2).

Chatham Cougars



Chatham got its first Presidents' Athletic Conference win on Sunday in a close 5-4 victory over Thomas More College ... Chatham got production from seven different players in the win with three players earning singles victories and four other players contributing to two doubles wins ... Earlier in the week, Chatham lost at Waynesburg University 6-2 ... The #1 singles match between Chatham freshman **Barb Petty** and Waynesburg's **Laura Garcia** had to be suspended due to darkness ... Petty won the first set 7-5 and has a 4-2 lead in the second set of the suspended match.

Geneva Golden Tornadoes



Geneva played its first PAC competition of the young season and cruised past Bethany 9-0 ... **Allison Krisza** continued to sizzle as she moved to 5-0 on the season with another straight set victory in #2 singles.

Grove City Wolverines



Grove City ran its win streak to 10 matches, dating back to 2006 with a 3-0 week, including PAC wins over Westminster and Bethany ... The Wolverines opened the week with a 6-3 victory at Allegheny ... It is GCC's third straight win over Allegheny ... **Nicole Andreini** and **Tamara Nations** combined for a win at first doubles while also winning their respective singles match ... Andreini, **Erin Bennett**, **Kristin McNally** and Nations all had two wins against both Westminster and Bethany ... **Julie Bellissimo** went 3-0 at third doubles during the week ... At 6-0, Grove City is off to its best start since the 1999 team opened 8-0 ... GCC will compete this week in the ITA Southeast Regional Championships.

Saint Vincent Bearcats

Freshman **Lindsey Burns** went 3-0 this week in singles competition for Thomas More ... The Saints will travel to Hanover Wednesday before going to the Berea Tri-match on Saturday.

Washington & Jefferson Presidents



Washington & Jefferson defeated Thomas More by a 6-3 margin in its season and PAC opener ... The Presidents won four of six singles contests and two of three doubles matches ... Junior **Kerri DiGiovanni** and freshman **Alyssa Tousignant** teamed for an 8-6 win at No. 2 doubles and Tousignant also claimed her singles match ... Junior **Samantha Knapik** and sophomore **Sara Charley** were victorious at No. 3 doubles and also both earned wins in singles action ... The Presidents are scheduled to play four matches this week, including three at home.

Waynesburg Yellow Jackets



The Yellow Jackets earned their first victory of the season Tuesday with a 6-2 PAC win vs. Chatham ... However, Waynesburg then suffered back-to-back 9-0 losses at Westminster and Penn State-Behrend ... Against the Cougars, sophomores **Allie Horochak** and **Jess Mally** scored an 8-4 victory at the second slot, while junior **Dana Davis** and sophomore **Carrie Daubert** tallied an 8-0 win over at the third position ... Freshman Blakely Mall extended the WU lead when she claimed 6-4, 6-0, at No. 2 singles and junior **Evelyn Fabian** tacked on a 6-3, 6-2 win at sixth singles ... Horochak and Mally also contributed straight-set victories in singles action against the Cougars.

Westminster Titans



Westminster went 1-1 during the week in PAC matches at Grove City on Wednesday and at home vs. Waynesburg on Saturday ... The Titans absorbed their first loss of the season after an 8-1 setback at Grove City before shutting out Waynesburg, 9-0 ... The Titans previously beat the Yellow Jackets in Waynesburg, 8-1, on Aug. 31, in a match that did not count toward PAC standings and rankings ... Senior **Christina Commisso** was the only Westminster player to go 2-0 in singles play last week as she beat Grove City's **Kait Garcia** and Waynesburg's **Allie Horochak** at No. 4 singles ... She also posted a 1-1 record at No. 1 doubles.
