victories against Chatham, with wins coming from senior **Sarah Goho** (7-5, 7-6) at #4 and senior **Jen Hubbell** (6-4, 6-1) at #5 ... The Bison very nearly recorded their first win of the year against W&J, but a pair of wins from sophomore **Ashley Current** just wasn't enough ... Current teamed with **Kathleen Thompson** for an 8-5 win at #1 doubles, then won in straight sets (7-5, 6-2) ... Bethany will close out the regular season Tuesday with a home match against Waynesburg, which will be the final one for seniors **Elise Gardner**, Goho, **Krista Holyak** and Hubbell.

Grove City Wolverines



Grove City wrapped up the regular season with a 9-0 victory over Waynesburg Friday ... The 10-2 Wolverines posted their 13th double-

digit win total since the program's inception in 1974 ... Junior **Tamara Nations** did not drop a game in singles or doubles play at Waynesburg ... **Erin Bennett, Kait Garcia, Chris Sager** and **Kristin Taylor** joined Nations as double-winners ... Tuesday, the Wolverines dropped a 9-0 verdict at D-II Slippery Rock ... Rain postponed the Wolverines' match at Penn State Behrend Thursday afternoon ... The Wolverines will participate in this weekend's PAC Championships in Erie ... Grove City is aiming for its 21st straight league crown.

Washington & Jefferson Presidents
