Hall recorded 362 yards of total offense Saturday for the Wolverines in a

28-21 loss to Carnegie Mellon. He rushed 30 times for 228 yards (7.6 avg.) and two TDs while also completing 13-of-27 passes for 134 yards. The 228 yards rushing are the most ever by a GCC quarterback and the most by any Wolverine player in 10 years, while the 362 total offensive yards marked the sixth-highest single-game total in school history.

Also nominated was sophomore RB John Proano of Westminster.

Johnson set a new SVC modern day record with 14 tackles (six solo, eight as-

sisted), including two TFL's, in the Bearcats' 19-14 near-upset loss to Bridgewater. In addition, he posted a 30-yard interception return to set up a Saint Vincent TD. He led an offense which held BC to just 10 offensive points and 290 yards on the game.

The teams have been matched up based on the final 2009 season finish in each league ... Highlighting the Series will be a battle of 2009 NCAA playoff participants and 2010 preseason Top 25 teams when W&J travels to Delaware Valley ... The only PAC team at home this weekend in Geneva, which hosts Albirght Saturday night.

Muschette rushed for 184 yards and three TDs in the win over FSU, moving him into fifth place on the GT career rushing yardage charts ... In his first career start, Westminster sophomore RB John Proano rushed for 123 yards on 23 carries with a seven-yard TD run in a win at Hiram ... WR Sheldon Loughner caught a pair of TD passes for Saint Vincent in the Bearcats' 19-14 loss to Bridgewater ... Senior LB Bobby Shew had a team-best nine tacklesm including 3.0 TFL and two sacks, vs. Marietta.

Waynesburg is 5-1 in non-league action over the past three seasons ... According to the 2010 NCAA D-III Football Record Book, Thomas More is the third winningest program in NCAA Division III history (139-66 over 20 years, .678 winning percentage).

Bethany Bison (0-1, 0-0 PAC)

The 2010 season got off to a disappointing start for the Bison, who suf-

fered a 28-0 loss to Allegheny Saturday ... Prior to the game, members of Bethany's 1965, '66, '75 and '80 PAC Championship teams were honored on the field as part of a "Weekend of Champions" celebration ... In the game, two early BC turnovers led directly to Allegheny points and the Bison offense, which was held to 202 total yards, was unable to generate any momentum ... RB Eric Walker rushed for 73 yards and caught six passes for 42 yards as well ... The Bison defense held the Gators to 288 total yards, the second-lowest total allowed since the 2007 season ... LB Kyle Arrington and FS Jeff Joyce each had 11 tackles and DE Kasib Taalib-Din made 8 stops, including a sack, and broke up a pass.

Saint Vincent Bearcats (0-1, 0-0 PAC)



The Bearcats were unable to pull off an upset victory in their

2010 season opener, as they were edged 19-14 by Bridgewater ... After falling behind 10-0 in the second quarter, the Bearcats rallied in the second half to pull to within 10-7 and 17-14, before the Eagles secured a safety late in the fourth quarter to clinch the win ... LB Anthony Johnson entered the school record books, besting his own single-game mark with 14 tackles, including 2.0 TFLs ... He also added a third guarter interception that led to SVC's first touchdown of the afternoon. Offensively, WR Sheldon Loughner was a second SVC player to establish a team record, as he scored both of the Bearcat touchdowns to become the team's modern day leader in TD catches with nine ... Defensively, the Bearcats yielded just 290 yards to the Eagles.

Washington & Jefferson travels 322 miles to Doylestown, Pa., for Saturday's opener at

Delaware Valley ... The Aggies opened Saturday night with a 27-7 victory at Muhlenberg ... The Aggies are 10th in the first D3football.com poll, while W&J is 21st ... DVC opens its season Saturday night at Muhlenberg ... Despite sharing the same state as most teams in the Middle Atlantic Conference, W&J has only faced a MAC opponent 12 times (7-5 record)



winning fashion, but by **Geno DeMarco**'s standards it was far from a masterpiece ... With four turnovers and a sub-par effort on defense, the Golden Tornadoes were fortunate to get out of Frostburg State with a 32-27 victory in a repeat of their 2009 opening victory against the Bobcats ... Despite the troubles, senior **Gerard Muschette** continued his assault on the Geneva record books moving into fifth place on the all-time list with 184 yards and three touchdowns in the victory ... Muschette was also Geneva's leading receiver with five catches for 48 yards ... Senior signal caller **David Girardi** was 14-of-24 passing for 164 yards in the win.

Thiel Tomcats (0-1, 0-0 PAC)



2010 campaign on Sept. 4 with a 28-7 loss to Marietta ... The season-opening loss was the third straight the Tomcats have suffered against the Pioneers (21-18 in 2008, 20-14 in 2009) ... The teams were stuck in a 7-7 stalemate after three quarters before Marietta broke away with 21 unanswered points in the fourth ... Senior LB Bobby Shew, who finished with nine tackles and two sacks, and sophomore DE Tim Taylor, who tallied eight tackles, repeatedly stuffed the Pioneer rushers at the line of scrimmage ... Senior DE Matt Shields and freshman LB Joe Kelly each forced fumbles while sophomore LB Ethan Ludwig had an interception for a defense that allowed iust 14 points and 224 yards ... Sophomore WR Tyler DeJong led the offense with three catches for a game-high 98 yards.

Waynesburg Yellow Jackets (0-0, 0-0 PAC)



After having its bye dur-

ing week one, the Waynesburg football team will make its season debut on Saturday when it travels to Wilkes-Barre, Pa. to face Wilkes College in the "PAC-MAC Football Challenge Series" ... The Yellow Jackets are led by senior QB **Brad Dawson**, who set a new school record for passing yards in a season (2,718) ... On the defensive side of the ball, junior DT **Darryl Moore, Jr.** is back after earning second-team All-PAC honors ... First-team All-PAC and All-ECAC kicker **Jon Storck** is another affective scoring weapon for head coach **Rick Shepas**. Grove City Wolverines (0-1, 0-0 PAC)



Grove City opened the 2010 season with a 28-21 setback

against longtime rival Carnegie Mellon Saturday at Thorn Field ... QB Clayton Hall made his first start at that position and accumulated 362 yards of total offense ... Hall ran for 228 yards, the most ever by a GCC quarterback ... He became the fourth Grove City back to rush for over 200 yards in a game ... The Wolverines gashed CMU for 309 rushing yards and 443 yards of total offense ... Defensively, CB Chris Korn made his first career start and led the Wolverines with eight tackles, including 2.5 for loss ... Marcus Chakot and Marc Shamley both had sacks ... The Wolverines recorded 11 tackles for loss and forced a pair of fumbles ... Grove City held a 12-minute edge in time of possession ... GCC had three drives of 10 or more plays that did not result in points.

Thomas More Saints (0-0, 0-0 PAC)



The Saints have an open date this week and will

open the 2010 season next Saturday (Sept. 11) when they travel to Hanover for a 1:30 p.m. kickoff ... Thomas More enters the season ranked as high as No. 12 this preseason in The Sporting News and USA Today Sports Weekly preseason polls ... The Saints are third winningest football program in Division III according to the 2010 NCAA Division III Football Record Book ... Head coach Jim Hilvert, who is 32-10 in three seasons at Thomas More, welcomes back 41 letterwinners, including 14 starters (five offense, seven defense and two specialists) ... Sophomore DB Zach Autenrieb and senior DT Tyler Owens have been named preseason All-Americans by multiple college football publications this offseason.

FDU-Florham was picked in the preseason to finish seventh in the MAC, after going 2-8 overall in 2009.
