It was the first Bearcat varsity football victory since the 1962 season and broke a streak of 11 consecutive losses for SVC dating back to last season.

The game was delayed by 45 minutes due to lightning ... W&J is now 4-0 all-time versus Frostburg State ... The Presidents have won 26 of their last 29 regular-season games at Cameron Stadium and has won 21 straight contests overall in the regular season dating back to the second week of 2006. Westminster junior tailback Nick McKolosky rushed 25 times for 143 yards and a career-high three touchdowns in last year's meeting ... His 143 rushing yards is currently the second-highest single-game total in his career...
