Thomas More remained unbeaten, as the 8-0 Saints defeated Westminster 37-13 to set up a meeting next week at 6-2 Waynesburg, which won its fourth straight game, 34-28, at Saint Vincent ... W&J held off a late Grove City rally to defeat the Wolverines 21-14 for their fifth straight win, while Geneva overame a 6-0 halftime deficit to win at Thiel, 34-20.

NEWS & NOTES: Geneva senior RB Gerard | AROUND THE LEAGUE: Saint Vincent RB Mike Muschette continued his stellar play by posting a Geneva single-game record 302 yards rushing (250 in the second half) with four TDs in a 34-20 GT win at Thiel ... Freshman RB Domonique Hayden of Thomas More rushed for 82 yards and a TD on 16 carries vs. Westminster ... Freshman RB Bertrand Mgampa rushed for 96 yards and a TD on 15 carries for Waynesburg at Saint Vincent ... Sophomore RB Tim McNerney rushed 25 times for 97 vards and two TDs for W&J against Grove City.

Kale set a school modern day single-game record with 133 yards rushing vs. Waynesburg ... Grove City TB Blaine Miller rushed for 64 yards and a pair of scores at Washington & Jefferson ... Westminster junior QB Shawn Lehocky threw for 180 yards and a TD while rushing for 38 yards and another score at Thomas More ... Freshman QB Jared Soell of Thiel threw for 196 yards and a TD while also rushing for 101 yards against Geneva ... Bethany was off last week.

Geneva responded by posting 34 second half points to defeat the Tomcats 34-20 and improve to 4-5 ... Gerard Muschette, who came into the game needing 410 yards to tie the school's all-time rushing mark, picked up a single game-record 302 yards on the ground, with 250 of those yards coming in the second half ... He also crossed the goal line four times to break the school record with 44 career TDs ... The defense came up big for the third straight week, allowing the offense to take control ... Geneva will enjoy its only off week of the season this Saturday.

#### Grove City Wolverines (3-5, 1-4 PAC)

Grove City dropped a 21-14 decision at Washington & Jefferson Saturday in PAC action ... The Wolverines converted 11-of-19 third downs and held possession for over 35 minutes in the game ... Blaine Miller ran for a pair of touchdowns ... TE Anthony Reda caught a careerhigh six passes for Grove City ... Luke O'Hara had five catches for 65 yards ... QB Brian Pell threw for 183 yards ... Defensively, Jason Ferguson and Marc Shamley both recorded sacks ... Reda became the seventh GCC player with 10 or more receptions ... It's the second straight season that Grove City has had seven players reach double figures in catches ... Four Wolverine quarterbacks have thrown touchdown passes this year: Pell, Zach Gross, Clayton Hall and Mike McDonald.

#### Saint Vincent Bearcats (2-6, 2-3 PAC)

Saint Vincent saw its senior day spoiled by Waynesburg

at Chuck Noll Field, as the Yellow Jackets scored 20 unanswered points in a sevenminute span in the fourth quarter to win 34-28 ... Despite the defeat, the Bearcats set a new team record with 454 yards of total offense, as Chace Ginyard established a new team mark with 161 receiving yards, and Mike Kale gained a record 133 yards on the ground ... Aaron Smetanka went 18-for-30 through the air for two touchdowns - both to Ginvard - and 303 yards, while adding a rushing TD ... Defensively, Anthony Johnson led the way with 10 tackles, while Alex Rowan and Armando Fortunato made nine tackles apiece ... Rowan and Johnson each tallied sacks, while Fortunato and Bryan Santos each had an interception.

## Thiel Tomcats (0-8, 0-5 PAC)

Thiel fell to visiting Geneva

College by a score of 34-20 at Alumni Stadium on Saturday ... The first half saw the Tomcat offense jumping ahead of the Golden Tornados 6-0 after two field goals by freshman Berend Grube ... Freshman QB Jared Soell finished the game with 196 yards and a touchdown through the air, in addition to his 101 rushing yards on 17 carries, while freshman RB Eric Petrovich had 96 yards rushing and 40 receiving ... Defensively for the Tomcats, it was sophomores Ethan Ludwig with 11 tackles, including one for a loss, and Tim Taylor who tallied six tackles, two for a loss and 1.5 sacks ... Also, freshman defender Jeff Oblisk combined with Tim Taylor on a sack and added in four tackles, while senior Will Haase had two tackles for losses.

## Thomas More Saints (8-0, 6-0 PAC)

Thomas More clinched at least a share of its

third straight PAC Championship with a 37-13 win over Westminster Saturday ... TMC was ranked No. 9 in last week's AFCA Top-25 and is No. 10 in this week's D3football.com's Top-25 ... Junior RB Kendall Owens finished the game with 253 all-purpose yards as he had eight rushes for 20 yards, five catches for 67 vards, three kick returns for 64 yards and two punt returns for 102 yards and a TD ... Sophomore QB Rob Kues was 12-of-23 passing for 181 yards and one TD and had 17 rushes for 50 yards and one touchdown, while freshman RB Domonique Hayden finished the game with 16 carries for 82 yards and one touchdown and had one catch for 12 yards ... Sophomore LB Nick Gramke led the defense with nine tackles.

## Washington & Jefferson Presidents (6-2, 4-1 PAC)



W&J won its fifth consecutive game and clinched a 27th consecutive winning season with

a 21-14 victory over Grove City on Senior Day Saturday at Cameron Stadium ... The Presidents raced out to a 21-point lead, thanks to to a pair of rushing touchdowns from sophomore RB Tim McNerney and a receiving score from senior WR Jordan Roycroft ... McNerney finished just three yards shy of a fourth-straight, 100-yard game with 97 yards on the ground and two scores ... Roycroft caught eight passes for 85 yards, while junior Adam Dominick grabbed five passes for 59 yards ... The defense was paced by senior LB Nick Resnik's career-high 12 tackles ... He also recovered a fumble ... Senior FS Craig Sedunov also had 12 stops and moved into fourth place on the school's career tackle chart.

#### Waynesburg Yellow Jackets (6-2, 4-1 PAC)



Thanks in large part to 20 unanswered fourth-quarter points, Waynesburg won its fourth game in a row by downing Saint Vincent 34-28 in Latrobe ... For the second straight game, sophomore DB Bryan Gary took an interception back for a touchdown ... His latest score put the Yellow Jackets ahead 28-21 ... Junior S Ryan Williams, who lined up at quarterback, scored two of Waynesburg's four rushing touchdowns on the day ... Senior QB Brad Dawson threw for 254 yards on the day, while freshman RB Bertrand Ngampa rushed for a team-best and season-high 96 yards and a touchdown ... Sophomore TE Adam Moses pulled in a Waynesburg-best nine catches for 98 yards.

#### Westminster Titans (2-6, 1-5 PAC)



Trailing by only seven points late in the third quarter, Westminster provided a mild scare for No. 9-ranked Thomas More Saturday ... However, Thomas More's field goal and 96-yard punt return for a touchdown helped clinch a 37-13 win over the visiting Titans in PAC action ... Junior QB Shawn Lehocky scored one TD and threw for another as he led the Titans with 180 yards on 20-of-38 passing, along with 38 rushing yards on 11 attempts ... Lehocky put the Titans on the board with a one-yard TD run with 12:34 remaining in the first half that cut Thomas More's deficit to 14-6 ... Westminster closed another gap to 20-13 when Lehocky connected with sophomore WR Geno Pasquinelli for a six-yard TD pass with 5:13 left in the third quarter ... Jake Brown led the Titan defense with 13 tackles (2.5 for loss).

# Saint Vincent (2-6, 2-3 PAC) at Westminster (2-6, 1-5 PAC)

Game Notes: The Bearcats will look for their first win over Westminster since a 34-0 triumph in week nine of the 1949 season, and their first-ever win in New Wilmington ... Westminster is 8-1 all-time vs. Saint Vincent including eight in a row and three straight wins since Saint Vincent brought back football in 2007 ... Last year, Westminster won at Saint Vincent 27-14 as senior RB Nick McKolosky carried the ball a career-high 31 times for 121 yards and a TD ... The Titan defense also intercepted Saint Vincent four times, including two by freshman Kyle Allen ... The last Bearcat trip to New Wilmington was in 2008 when Westminster scored three unanswered touchdown in the third quarter for a 31-24 win after a 10-10 halftime tie ... Westminster is 9-7 in its last 16 home PAC games ... Saint Vincent needs just 90 rushing yards to eclipse 1,000 as a team on the year, which would be a first in the team's four-year modern history ... Westminster sophomore WR Geno Pasquinelli has tied a school record with a five-game touchdown reception streak ... The game features the PAC's top four leading tacklers in Westminster senior linebackers Tom Geraghty (11.2 per game) and Cory Meeker (9.6) and Saint Vincent juniors Anthony Johnson (9.6) and Armando Fortunato (9.0).

Game Notes: Washington & Jefferson and Thiel will battle for the 64th time in history on Saturday with the Presidents holding a 39-22-2 edge ... W&J has claimed 27 of the last 28 games in the series ... The Tomcats have lost four straight games to the Presidents, with the last win coming during Thiel's undefeated 2005 season ... The Presidents piled up 537 yards of total offense and rolled to a 56-16 victory over Thiel last season ... Gino Rometo passed for 240 yards and three touchdowns, while Matthew Gal broke up four pass plays ... Thiel enters the game ranked first in the PAC in pass defense, giving up 153.6 yards per game... The Tomcats' Tim Taylor, Ethan Ludwig and Bobby Shew are all in the top 10 in the conference in tackles for loss... Thiel had a player break 100 yards rushing in a game for the first time this season as quarterback Jared Soell ran for 101 yards on 17 carries in a loss to Geneva last week.

Series Record: Grove City leads 40-22-2

Game Notes: Grove City begins a two-game homestand to end the regular season, as the Wolverines host Bethany at Robert E. Thorn Field Saturday ... GCC has won three straight over the Bison overall and six straight at Thorn Field ... With a 35-14 victory at Bethany last year, GCC has also won 12 of the last 13 meetings dating back to 1996 ... The Bison have dropped seven straight in Grove City, with their last win coming in 1995 (13-6) ... Bethany can improve to 4-1 on the road this year with a win Saturday, which would be their best road slate since going a perfect 5-0 on their way to the 1980 PAC championship ... WB Ed Reith is averaging 6.5 yards per carry, which is the highest average by a Grove City back since 1998, when dual-threat quarterback Steve Lacinski averaged 6.9 yards per attempt ... This is Grove City's first 1:30 kickoff since September 25 at Waynesburg ... This is the latest that Grove City and Bethany have played in a season since 1971, when the teams played to a 6-6 tie in the season finale ... Currently Wolverine head coach Chris Smith concluded his playing career for Grove City that day. With 2,321 career rushing yards, Bethany RB Eric Walker needs 48 yards to surpass Ernie Whitted (2,368) for 3<sup>rd</sup> place on the school's all-time rushing list ... Walker and QB Matt Grimard both have 10 rushing TDs this year, one behind Walker's BC-record of 11 set last year.

Waynesburg will go for its fifth win in a row Saturday against the ninth (AFCA)/10th (D3Football.com)-ranked Saints ... Thanks to its month-long winning streak, the Yellow Jackets have put themselves in position to make a run at a PAC title ... However, to reach that lofty goal, the Jackets must find a way to end Thomas More's 20-game regular season winning streak ... Waynesburg must also put a stop to the Saints' two-game winning streak against the Jackets and gain some ground in the all-time series, which stands at 5-2 in favor of the defending PAC champions ... The Saints are 2-1 all-time in games played at Wiley Stadium in Waynesburg.
