CHRIS EDWARDS

Washington & Jefferson College

Senior quarterback - 6-3, 215
 Uniontown, Ohio/Green H.S.

Edwards completed 17-of-31 passes for 373 yards and four touchdowns (43, 3, 41, 7) for W&J in a 32-14 PAC win at Thomas More. he surpassed the 3,000-yard passing mark for the season and the 8,000-yard mark for his career, while bringing his career TD total to 85.

Also nominated was junior WR **T.J. Parker (Austintown, Ohio/Austintown Fitch H.S.)**, junior SE **Scott Fichter (Pittsburgh, Pa./North Hills H.S.)** of Grove City, senior WR **Brandon Chambers (Farrell, Pa./Farrell H.S.)** of Thiel, junior QB **Tres Cobb (Clarksville, Ind./Our Lady of Providence H.S.)** of Waynesburg, and sophomore WR **Brett Ziegler (Somerset/Somerset H.S.)** of Westminster.

Bethany College

Senior linebacker - 5-8, 213

Goetz posted a game-high 20 tackles, including a pair of tackles for losses, for the Bison in a 30-15 loss to Carnegie Mellon. He finished the season with 120 total tackles for Bethany and his four-year BC career with 307 stops.

PAC FOOTBALL CAPSULES



Bethany Bison

Bethany closed the 2005 season with a 30-15 loss to visiting Carnegie Mellon Saturday ... The Bison fell behind 23-0 early in the third quarter and rallied to within 23-15 midway through the fourth quarter ... WR **T.J. Parker** caught six passes for 91 yards and his ninth TD of the season, a 26-yard scoring reception in the fourth quarter that broke the BC single-season record ... Fellow WR **Milton Joyner** hauled in five balls for 82 yards and a 42-yard score ... Delivering the scoring throws was freshman **Matt Blumer**, who was 14-of-30 for 223 yards and the two TDs in his first collegiate start ... Bethany outgained CMU 398-305 for the game ... Defensively, LB **Tim Goetz** made 20 tackles in his final game, giving him 120 for the season, while **Cliff Anderson** also reached exactly 100 for the season with 12 stops.



Thiel Tomcats

Thiel closed its home schedule Saturday with a 21-3 victory over Buffalo State ... Senior WR **Brandon Chambers** posted 167 receiving yards and a pair of TDs (24, 67) ... Chambers, now with 27 career TD receptions, is tied for first-place in the Thiel annals with **John Gibson** (1967-69) ... He is also just 65 yards short of posting back-to-back 1,000 yard seasons ... Senior QB **Darrell Satterfield** finished 14-of-32 for 261 yards and two TD passes ... Satterfield holds the Thiel career TD pass record with 33 ... The Tomcat defense posted seven sacks and 13 tackles for loss, led by senior DT **Jon Howson** (seven total stops, 2.5 tackles for loss and 1.5 sacks) and senior DE **Kevin Strouse** (five total stops, 3.0 tackles for loss and 1.5 sacks).



Washington & Jefferson Presidents

Senior QB **Chris Edwards** went over 3,000 passing yards for the season after totaling 373 yards and four TDs in the Presidents' 32-14 win at Thomas More ... The victory marked the ninth time since 1992 that W&J has totaled at least nine wins in a season ... Senior WR **Aaron Krepps** caught five passes to bring his career total to 173 which moved him into second place on the school's all-time list ... W&J racked up 503 total yards on the Saints and junior RB **Ryan Mendel** was the leading rusher with 79 yards and one TD on 19 attempts ... Senior RB **R.J. Zitzelsberger** added 106 combined yards and a seven-yard TD reception ... Junior LB **Eric Taslov** had a career-high 12 tackles ... Senior DL **Dan Brodland** recorded two sacks.



Westminster Titans

The Titans posted a come-from-behind 14-13 PAC win over Grove City on Senior Day at Burry Stadium ... Reserve sophomore QB **Brett Myers** led the Titans on a 14-play, 80-yard drive in the final three minutes, capped by an 11-yard TD pass to sophomore WR **Brett Ziegler** with 16 seconds to play to tie the game at 13-13 ... The conversion kick by senior K **Chris Castillo** gave the Titans the win ... Ziegler earlier caught a 43-yard scoring bomb from starting junior QB **J.R. Barley** ... Senior RB **Sean Buggiey** led all rushers in the game with 24 carries for 71 yards ... Defensively, junior ILB **Jason Fridley** led the Titans with 13 total tackles (10 solo) ... Senior DE **Matt Hanhold** posted a fumble recovery, while senior DE **Adam Hadbavny** had a team-best three tackles for losses and a quarterback sack.



Grove City Wolverines

Grove City closed the 2005 season Saturday with a heartbreaking 14-13 loss at Westminster ... **Scott Fichter** caught a 47-yard touchdown pass from **Bradford Clark** while **Ross Trimmer** returned a fumble 42 yards for a third-quarter touchdown ... **Bill Waugh** had nine tackles and a sack while **Aaron Margo** had a team-high 10 tackles ... **Shane Coughlin** recorded his second interception of the year while **Dave Issler** also picked off a pass ... As a team, Grove City blocked eight kicks this season, a new school record ... Fichter has a team-high 37 catches, the most for a GCC player since **Dave DiDonato** caught 52 in 2003 ... **Aaron Margo** became the first Grove City DB to lead the team in tackles since **Rich Shields** had 84 stops in 1995.



Thomas More Saints

Washington & Jefferson scored 26 unanswered points in sending Thomas More to its second straight loss, 32-14 ... LB **Mark Carlisle** registered a career-high 20 tackles, 13 solos, in the defeat as the Saints held W&J 13 points below their scoring average and more than 100 yards less than their yardage total ... S **Nick Hazlett** also recorded a career-high with 19 stops ... Sophomore WR **John Resch** hauled in a career-high seven passes for a career-high 82 yards ... After their first two-game losing streak of the season, the Saints are looking to secure a winning season by beating rival Mount St. Joseph in Bridge Bowl XI ... Junior CB **Chris Willis** is still in search of an elusive school record-tying seventh interception ... It will be the last game for 17 TMC seniors



Waynesburg Yellow Jackets

For the second time in three weeks, a decisive blocked punt played an instrumental part in a Waynesburg loss ... The Yellow Jackets lost in their final road contest of the season, 17-10, in overtime to Frostburg State as a blocked punt led to an early TD by the Bobcats ... In the overtime period, the Bobcats used just four plays to post a 17-10 lead when they scored on a four-yard run ... The Yellow Jackets appeared poised to tie the contest after **Ryan Abels** rushed for a first down on the first play of the Yellow Jackets' overtime possession. However, Waynesburg would get no closer, as it lost its second overtime contest of the season ... Frostburg State limited Abels to 84 yards on 20 carries, including a 10-yard touchdown in the third quarter.

Westminster (4-5, 2-3 PAC) at Waynesburg (3-6, 1-4 PAC)

Series Record: Westminster leads 35-28-3

Game Notes: The Titans and Yellow Jackets face off in the final PAC contest of the season as Waynesburg holds its Senior Day activities ... The game marks the return of first-year Westminster head coach **Jeff Hand** to Waynesburg, where he led the Yellow Jacket program for four years (24-17 from 2001-04), including capturing the school's first PAC Championship in 2003 ... Waynesburg has won the last two meetings in the series (which dates back to 1910) ... In last season's meeting, the Waynesburg defense held on a fourth-down play with less than two minutes left in the game to seal an 18-13 victory in New Wilmington ... RBs **Ryan Abels** and **Eric Daniels** combined to rush for 120 yards on 32 carries and two TDs, including the game-winner by Daniels with 6:54 left in the game ... The contest will also be a homecoming of sorts for three Westminster assistant coaches ... Among Hand's Titan coaching staff are three former Yellow Jackets: **Paul D'Imperio** (WR 2001-04), **Sean Ross** (LB 2000-03) and **Clark Rolli** (LB 1998-2002) ... When D'Imperio graduated from Waynesburg last spring, he held the school career receptions record at 155, which has since been broken by both **Ivan Hawkins** and **Dominick Hunter** ... Hunter ranks first in school history with 173 career catches, while Hawkins is second with 168.

Series Record: Carnegie Mellon leads 27-9-2

Game Notes: Thiel and Carnegie Mellon meet for the first time since 1989 Saturday at Gesling Stadium in Pittsburgh ... The Tartans (5-4) hold a 27-9-2 edge in the 38-game series, with the beginning of the series dating back to 1915 (as Carnegie Tech) ... As PAC members CMU was 12-4-2 against Thiel ... The Tartans have secured their 31st straight non-losing season ... Senior WR **Brandon Chambers** needs just 65 receiving yards to post back-to-back 1,000 yard campaigns ... The Thiel offense has clicked on the road this season, outscoring opponents 149 (37.3 ppg)-to-63 (15.8 ppg) ... The Tomcats have three receivers with 400-plus yards for the first time in school history: (Chambers-935), senior WR **Tom McEntire** (497) and sophomore WR **Marc LaScola** (402).

Game Notes: The Saints close the 2005 season against local rival Mount St. Joseph in a non-conference contest ... Thomas More hold the season series at 9-1, but the Lions hold the most recent victory .. Mount St. Joseph enters the game having already secured the Heartland Conference championship for the second straight season ... Last season's win for the Lions was the second largest margin of victory in the series.
