JACOB HABEL

Washington & Jefferson College

Sophomore - 133 pounds Fredonia, Pa./Reynolds H.S.

Habel was a perfect 3-0 for the Presidents at the 5th Annual Sam Case Green Terror Duals at McDaniel College in Westminster, Md., this weekend. He posted a 14-7 win over Ben Mellring of Thiel and a 9-1 triumph against Justin Bauman of Messiah before moving up to 141 pounds and notching a 5-3 decision against Nick Demionovich of Maryland-Baltimore County.

Also nominated was junior 149-pounder **Mike Kemble** of Thiel and sophomore 174-pounder **Tyler Allen** of Waynesburg.

Thiel Tomcats



The Tomcat wrestling squad finished 3-0 at Saturday's Sam Case Green Terror Duals, hosted by McDaniel College ... Junior 149pound Mike Kemble

posted a perfect 3-0 record, including a pair of pin fall wins, and was named the outstanding wrestler of the event ... The Tomcats were named champions in the Gold Division ... The number one Thiel squad, ranked 22nd in the latest Brute-Adidas National Wrestling Coaches Association Division III team ranking, opened the day with a 46-6 victory over Elizabethtown and recorded a 44-9 win over PAC rival Washington & Jefferson in round two ... In round four, the Tomcats earned a 24-22 win over host McDaniel, who were ranked 25th in the latest team rankings ... Kemble opened the day with a pair of pin fall victories, defeating Jereme Heisey of Elizabethtown and Pete Ellers of Washington & Jefferson ... He finished his day with an 8-2 decision over McDaniel's Mark Nakasone ... Sophomore Anthony Prvonozac went 3-0 at 141 pounds, earning a pin fall win over Elizabethtown's Stephon Finley and a 4-1 decision over McDaniel's Rob Wiley ... Prvonozac picked up a forfeit victory against Wash. & Jeff.

Terror Duals hosted by McDaniel College ... Sophomore 133-pounder Jacob Habel won all three of his matches to lead the Presidents ... He earned a 14-7 win against Thiel's Ben Mellring and then posted a 9-1 triumph over Messiah's Justin Bauman ... Habel also recorded a 5-3 victory over UMBC's Nick Demionovich after moving up to 141 pounds ... Senior 197-pounder Ryan Wiles notched a pair of victories. Wiles defeated UMBC's Anthony Romero, 2-0, and then pinned Thiel's Matt Zakrajsek before falling to Messiah's Mike Lengel by a 5-3 margin ... Junior heavyweight Phil McCormick and sophomore 149-pounder Pete Elers also earned two wins in three matches ... McCormick topped UMBC's Brian Johnson, 7-4, and also edged Messiah's Ethan Bucarey by a 6-3 margin, while Elers opened with a 2-0 victory against John Loss of UMBC and then routed Messiah's Trey Speers, 13-5 ... Washington & Jefferson opens its 2005 home schedule Thursday when the Presidents take on Mercyhurst-Northeast in an exhibition dual match at 7:00 pm.

Waynesburg Yellow Jackets



Waynesburg wrestling competed in its first dual action of the young season this weekend at Baldwin-Wallace ... The Yellow Jackets lost their opening matches against Case Western Reserve.

34-14, and host B-W, 37-3, before defeating Mount St. Joseph (Ohio), 27-26 ... A trio of Waynesburg wrestlers posted a 2-1 mark at dual meet ... In the win over the Lions, the Yellow Jackets found themselves down 15-0 after the opening three matches before they won the next five bouts ... Senior Ken Laird started the comeback when he recorded a pin at the 4:18 mark in the 149-lbs. bout ... Freshman Jake Benczo trimmed the lead to 15-12 after a pin 157-lbs ... Benczo's classmate Jason Weeks tied the match at 15-15 with 7-2 decision in the 165-lbs. bout ... Sophomore Tyler Allen gave Waynesburg its first lead of the match, 21-15, when he registered a pin at the 2:59 mark ... The pin proved critical proved crucial, as both teams exchanged forfeits in the next two weight classes ... Entering the heavyweight bout, the Yellow Jackets held a 27-23, needing to avoid a pinfall to claim victory ... Despite losing the bout, L.R. Neubauer prevented the pinfall, so Waynesburg claimed a 27-26 win over Mount St. Joseph ... In the match against B-W, junior Dave Thorn posted the lone Yellow Jacket victory, posting a 7-1 decision at 125-lbs ... Thorn started Waynesburg with a 4-0 lead against Case Western with a 13-0 major decision, but losing the lead freshman Michael Wilkins reclaimed it with a 3-0 decision before Laird expanded the lead to 10-6 with a 9-3 decision at 149-lbs ... Following back-to-back losses, Allen won at 174-lbs. via a 10-8 decision, but the Yellow Jackets would lose their final three matches.
