PAC regular season champion and unbeaten (14-0-3) Thomas More is the top seed and will host #4 Westminster at 2 p.m., while two-time defending PAC champion Washington & Jefferson is the second seed and will host #3 Grove City at 7 p.m. ... The top remaining seed will host the title match Saturday at a time TBA.

NEWS & NOTES: Waynesburg (10-6-3) finished the season with the most wins for the Yellow Jackets in a season since 2001, while posting the program's first winning record since before 2001 ... Bethany senior F **Cassie Spalding** became just the fifth Bison to reach 100 career points with two goals and an assist at Chatham ... Junior M **Sara Harrison** scored the game-winning goal in overtime for Thomas More at Grove City Saturday ... **Catherine Czapski** scored the OT gamewinner for Saint Vincent in a 1-0 win at Geneva.

AROUND THE LEAGUE: Senior Fs Hannah Yang of Grove City and Sarah Nee of Westminster each scored three goals last week to finish the season with 16 goals apiece ...
